

To mark this occasion, we will be holding a Science Fair on **Wednesday, 12th March**. We encourage all children to participate by creating their own science-themed projects at home. This is a fantastic opportunity for your child to engage with science. We suggest this could be a wonderful project to undertake together with your child during the half-term break, making it a shared and enjoyable experience for the whole family.
